

French and English among health care workers in **Quebec**, 2021

In 2021, **55.4%** of health care workers in Quebec were French–English bilingual, up from **52.5%** in 2016.

The proportion of those who knew French remained stable over the period from 2016 (97.8%) to 2021 (97.3%).





Health care workers who lived in Montréal used English at work more often than health care workers who lived in another region.
